

School Times

School begins at 8.50am and finishes at 2.45pm (1.45pm for infants). The school is open to receive children from 8.35am onwards. Entrance doors are on timed magnetic locks and at 9am these doors will lock again. This means that during the school day, all visitors must come to the main entrance to gain access to the building and to classrooms.

In the morning, pupils from fourth, fifth and sixth class should assemble in the playground at the Red entrance door; second and third classes should assemble in their playground at the back of the school; senior infant and first classes should assemble in the playground at the Yellow entrance door. When the bell rings, the teachers will collect their classes from their assembly points. Junior infants are permitted to go directly to their classrooms.

Please note that the school accepts responsibility for the children during school hours only. Parents/ Guardians who decide to leave children to school before school opening time and after school closing time do so at their own risk and the Board of Management does not accept any responsibility for ensuring the safety of such pupils.



Traffic Tips

The school carpark gets very busy in the mornings and delays are being caused by the volume of traffic entering and leaving the carpark. To help reduce delays, please cooperate with the following arrangements

- Parents with children in older classes are asked to drop their children at the roundabout outside the school and allow them to walk in from there.
- If you come into the carpark, and do not need to park, please continue driving around the carpark to the drop off zone alongside the pitch. Let the pupils out and allow them to walk to their designated playgrounds.
- If you come into the carpark and need to park, please bring pupils to their playground (or classroom for Junior Infants) and return to your car as quickly as possible to free up the carparking space for others.

The staff carpark is strictly reserved for staff parking and accessible parking only.

We are very grateful to the parents who have helped to keep traffic flowing at the pedestrian crossing in the car park each morning. Volunteers are needed for the term ahead. If you can volunteer one morning a week, please contact Emer O'Reilly on 086 6044447.

Each pupil has received a copy of the Gratitude Calendar. During the month of September, teachers will chat about the calendar and instil an attitude of gratitude in each child.

We would ask parents to encourage your children to continue to do this throughout the week and at the weekend.

Sometimes it's easy to mistake gratitude for manners. After all, it's easy to teach a child to say "thank you" but teaching a child true gratitude will help them discover how to feel grateful about the people, things and activities in their lives.

The benefits of gratitude for children include increased feelings of wellbeing and reduced feelings of depression and disconnection. Positive relationships and even improved school satisfaction can result from introducing the practice of gratitude in schools



Healthy Eating

In line with our emphasis on health and physical activity, we encourage pupils to bring healthy lunches to school. As a general rule, pupils are allowed a treat on Friday. We encourage you to give your child a sandwich, a piece of fruit and a drink daily. Pupils are given ten minutes daily to eat their lunches at their desks before they go out to break.
